Saturday, August 7 (9am–12noon)

Mita Saldana, BOOKMAKING BASICS

Mita, one of the founders of LIBROS, is owner/operator of Against the Grain – Center for Bookbinding Arts. Mita will join us to review information for exhibiting in the 2010 New Mexico State Fair. She will then speak to us on the basics of bookmaking. She will explain the various adhesives used, determining grain, folding, cutting, bookcloth and mitering corners. There will be an overview of the classes and services offered at Against the Grain and a Q&A session, so bring all your bookbinding questions!

Saturday, September 4 (9am–12noon)

“Unsquare Books” with Esther Feske and Charlotte Kylin

Esther and Charlotte will be teaching two of the popular book forms displayed at the LIBROS’ April Exhibition at the Albuquerque Main Library. These books received many ooohs and aaahs from everyone.

Triangle Fold: Starting with squares of paper, this format is a fun starting place for a movable sculpture, a content-less book, or an experiment in color. It’s really easier than it looks.

Spiral Book: Charlotte’s entry in this recent show is simply an nonsquare accordion fold! Esther has worked out instructions for other more challenging nonsquare books to try.

Lettering for Book Artists, Esther Feske

Esther is an accomplished calligrapher and a member of Escribiente. She is excited to share some of her much requested techniques with us. Starting with your existing printing and handwriting skills, several variations are possible that will give you artistic writing styles for your books. Lots of ideas will be provided, and you can choose which ones you like best. Of course, as you practice and use any writing style, you get more at ease and it becomes your personalized expression. We will use ordinary pointed markers and end up with an exemplar book of styles to take home.

Ribbon Bound Journal, with Toni Lyons

Toni will share this easy no-sewing-necessary technique for making a personal journal from an old book. This is a quick and easy way to make a journal. A variety of papers can be used within the same signature. So, collect all those wonderful papers you’ve been wanting to use.

Saturday, December 4 (9am–12noon)

Annual Blank Book Project for Barrett House

Each December the members of LIBROS take time from their busy holiday schedules to make decorated blank books for Barrett House, a shelter for abused women and their children. The books are used as journals or as gifts that the children can give their moms. Bring your basic bookmaking kits and supplies (ribbon, yarn, beads, papers, images, etc). You may also wish to bring supplies for the children: stickers, colored pencils, glue sticks – anything fun and festive that they can use to decorate their books. We will also have an idea exchange on embellishments and closures.

This is also the time for our annual holiday party. Bring a treat to share and a White Elephant gift to exchange (valued under \$6). This is a fun way to learn or refresh some basics and to share our love of books and bookmaking with others.

Saturday, January 8 (9am–12noon)

Book Arts and Paper Arts of Mexico, with Kent Swanson

Kent will discuss *papel picado* (intricate cutwork paper), *papel amate* (which many of us know as bark paper), and the Aztec and Maya codices. He will also demonstrate how amate paper is made and have the group do some basic papermaking.

Annual LIBROS Collaborative Book Project, with Geri Michelli and Rachel Ballantyne.

All participating members will bring their finished pages. The meeting will then be devoted to assembling the books. Everyone is welcome to attend. Information on the collaborative book theme and format will be available sometime in November so please stand by.

Gallery Fold (presenter to be announced)

The Gallery Fold Book “displays” tiny works of art in a stand-up “art gallery” which then folds into a book. It is a variation of the accordion, so it is easier than it looks and the results are wonderful. The skills required are visualizing, measuring, cutting and folding, and you will look like a paper-folding genius! Bring 6 to 10 small artworks (perhaps inch-square scraps from other art or 35mm contact prints for your gallery). This book was a favorite at last year’s library show.

Saturday, April 2 (9am–12noon)

Nature Journaling, with Margy O’Brien

Celebrated artist Margy O’Brien will ignite your interest in nature and nature journaling. Her beautiful nature journals will inspire you to try one of your own. Margy will address drawing and documentation, as well as display many examples of tools and supplies. She will also address journal and paper selection and how to assemble a traveling journal kit to take on your nature outings.

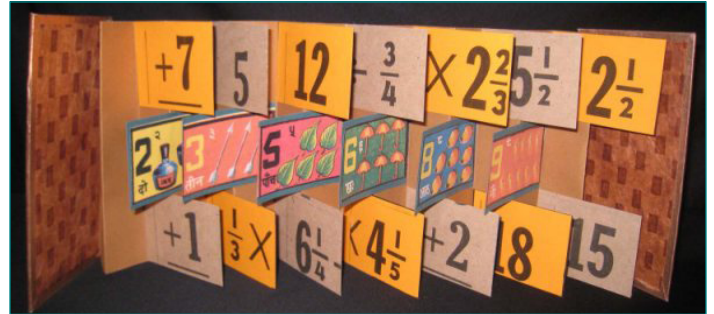

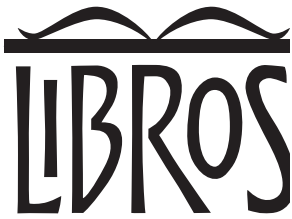

LIBROS STUDY GROUP

The LIBROS Bookbinding Study Group was board-approved in 2005 to encourage those who wanted the challenge of learning new bookbinding techniques and structures beyond the time limitations of the regular meeting.

In August, the Bookbinding Study Group will begin to calendar their schedule for 2011. The calendar is divided in two-month segments and members of the group choose the dates and the projects for the remainder of the group. It is expected that participants will have the basic bookbinding skills behind them and then can enjoy working with others on bookbinding and book arts activities. Study group members are asked to participate on a regular basis and to prepare and offer presentations, rotating through the schedule with all other participants in the group.

During the past year, the group studied Daniel Kelm's wire edge binding, Keith Smith's exposed spine bindings, making woodcuts and using the boards as covers as well as exchanging prints with others in the group, variations on Hedi Kyle's Secret Belgian Binding, the checkerboard binding, pop-ups, embellishing metal covers, and various methods of closures.
